This is the first podium finish in the history of Canberra Secondary School Volleyball CCA for both the Boys and Girls Teams!

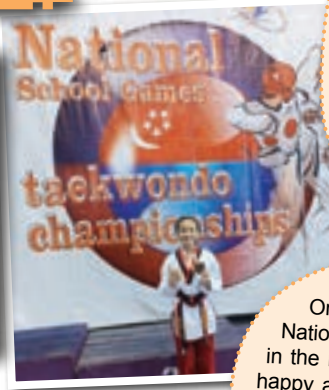
