- Approach a trusted adult and seek his/her help. Have a conversation with this person about what would be best for you.
- Make a decision and take action based on your options.

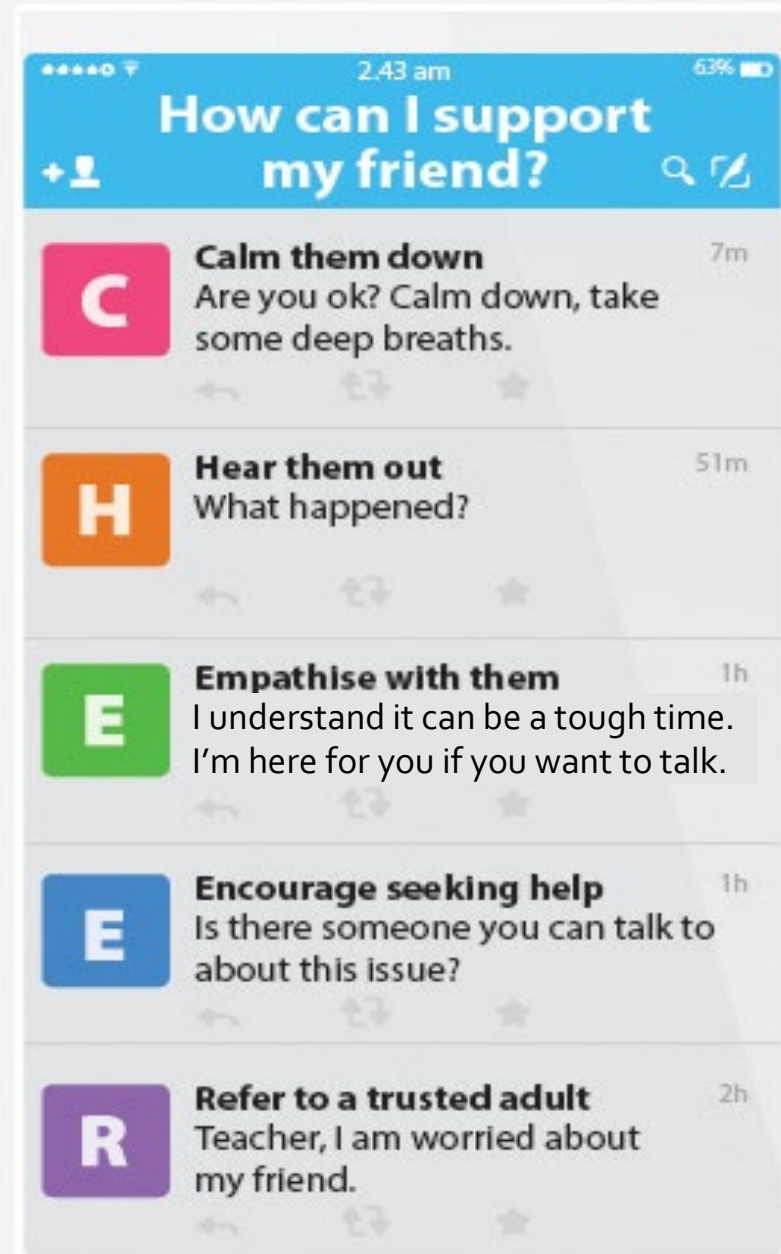


Supporting Your Friend

Joint Admissions Exercise (JAE)

Students who wish to apply for admission for junior colleges (JC), Millennia Institute (MI), polytechnics and the Institute of Technical Education (ITE) may do so via the Joint Admissions Exercise (JAE) using their GCE O-Level examination results.

Eligible school candidates will receive a digital copy of Form A via their registered email addresses from 2 pm on Thursday, 11 January 2024. All candidates eligible for JAE may also download a copy of Form A from the JAE-Internet System (JAE-IS) during the application period.

Joint Admissions Exercise (JAE)

The JAE-IS will be accessible from 4 pm on Thursday, 11 January 2024, to 4 pm on Tuesday, 16 January 2024 for applicants to submit their course choices through the JAE website at www.moe.gov.sg/jae.

Applicant are strongly encouraged to use toe JAE worksheet (www.moe.gov.sg/jaeworksheet) before submitting their online application.

Joint Admissions Exercise (JAE)

Students are to consider all 12 course choices wisely and make full use of them, where applicable.

The choices should be listed in the order of preference.

Please visit the websites on SchoolFinder and CourseFinder and use the JAE Worksheet as a template to prepare the relevant information.

Direct School Admission (DSA) - JCs

Students who had accepted offers through the 2023 Direct School Admission – Junior Colleges (DSA-JC) will be admitted to their chosen JC if they have met the eligibility criteria for admission based on their GCE O-Level examination results.

Students admitted to a JC through DSA-JC will not be eligible to participate in the JAE.

Students who do not meet the JC admission criteria may take part in the JAE to apply for other courses which they are eligible for.

Junior Colleges and Millennia Institute

JCs and MI offer a variety of subjects and different subject combinations. They may also set their own school-based criteria for subjects offered, based on professional and student-centric considerations.

Posting to an Arts, Science or Commerce course does not guarantee that students will be able to offer their preferred subject combinations. Students should check the website of the respective JCs and MI for more details on the subject combinations offered in the Arts, Science and Commerce courses and school-based criteria for subjects offered.

Polytechnics & ITEs

Beyond academic requirements, students should note that some polytechnic/ITE courses may require students to meet non-academic requirements, such as passing of medical examinations, in order to comply with industry requirements.

Students are advised to take these requirements into account when making their choices.

Joint Admissions Exercise (JAE)

For students who are unable to submit their application via the JAE-IS (e.g. not eligible to apply for Singpass), or need to update their citizenship or residential address, they can submit a request for assistance using the online JAE Request Form during the JAE application

Please note that the online form will only be activated during the application period.

Joint Admissions Exercise (JAE)

Upon successful submission of their application, the verification slip will be sent to the email address provided by the student in the JAE-IS.

The Language Elective Programme (LEP) for Chinese, Malay, and Tamil aims to nurture promising students to attain a high level of language proficiency in their Mother Tongue Language (MTL), and enhance their understanding of MTL Literature. All LEP students at the Pre-U level must offer H2 Chinese/ Malay/ Tamil Language & Literature at A-Level. Outstanding students selected for the programme will be considered for the Language Elective Scholarship.
